

ECONOMICS MAJOR

The requirements for the Economics Major are: Business 201, 205 and 218, Economics 200, 300, 301, 371, 400 and three upper level economics electives. Students considering graduate school are strongly encouraged to take additional quantitative courses especially Math 151 Calculus I and Math 152 Calculus II. Economics is a more broad-based than business and considers a wider range of social issues. It can be an excellent preparation for a career in business, banking, finance, and government.

Notes:

1. Business 105 is recommended but not required. It should be taken in the 1st or 2nd semester.
2. Economics 200 should be taken by the end of the sophomore year. Taking Econ 200, 300 & 301 before taking upper level electives will lead to a more complete understanding of the electives and will facilitate off-campus study.
3. Economics majors should have strong quantitative skills.
4. Econ 300 & 301 may be delayed until the junior year (see note #2).
5. Math 151 & 152 are highly recommended for graduate school but are not required for the major.
6. Econ 371 is not offered every year. Students should take the course in their sixth semester when possible.
7. Majors are urged to consider off-campus study. Usually off-campus study occurs during the sixth or seventh semester. The Washington program is a highly desirable experience.
8. Majors who do not study off-campus are encouraged to undertake a local public policy oriented internship during the senior year.
9. Business 306 and 356 are not required but are highly recommended. Accounting 203 is a pre-requisite for Business 306 and is normally taken in the 4th or 5th semester.
