NOTES:

1. The History curriculum is designed to be taken in order. Ideally, all History majors should take 100-level classes in the freshman year, then 200-level classes in the sophomore year, 300-level classes in the junior year, and 400-level courses in the senior year. However, freshmen can take 200-level classes (although we prefer that at least one 100-level course be taken first). Juniors and seniors can take any level of class. We *strongly discourage* any freshman or sophomore from taking a 300- or 400-level class.
2. Every History course with a "1" in the tens place (i.e. 110) is a U.S. course. Every course with a "2" in the tens place (i.e. 420) is a World History course. Every "3" in the tens place (i.e. 230) denotes a European course.
3. HIST 220: Modern Global History, is a required course for all majors, taken ideally in the sophomore year.
4. The History major requires 9.5 credits distributed as follows:
 - a. 1.5 credits at the 100 level
 - b. 2 credits at the 200 level
 - c. 2 credits at the 300 level
 - d. 2 credits at the 400 level
5. The History major further requires:
 - a. 1 credit in U.S. history

- b. 1 credit in World history
 - c. 1 credit in European history
6. Courses may overlap and be counted in two categories. For example, HIST 420: Modern Latin American History is a 1-credit History class. You may count it to fulfill simultaneously our World requirement and one of your 400-level requirements.
 7. HIST 192: History Seminar is a .25-credit course that students must take twice: once in their freshman year and once during the semester they are also taking one of the 300-level courses.
 8. Students are strongly encouraged to study off campus during their junior year.
