

Business Administration

Courses are listed in the earliest semester in which it is recommended that they be taken. In most cases, the courses may be taken in a later semester without serious consequence. See the notes below for recommendations related to individual courses. The following courses are required: Business 105, 201, 205, 218, 305, 306, 307, Business Capstone (Busi 405, 406 or 409), Accounting 203, Economics 200, Intermediate Economic Theory (Econ 300 or 301) and three upper-level elective courses (ACCT, BUSI, or ECON at the 300 or 400 level).

Busi 105 should be taken in the 1st or 2nd semester. In most cases, it should be the first course in the program.

Econ 200 is normally taken in the 2nd semester but may be taken in 1st or 3rd semester.

Busi 201 should be taken in the 2nd or 3rd semester.

Busi 205 should be taken in the 3rd or 4th semester. It should be taken immediately after Business 201.

Acct 203 is normally taken in the sophomore year (3rd or 4th semester). The 5th semester is also acceptable.

Business 218 should be taken in the sophomore year or junior year. It is a 0.5 credit course that meets all semester.

Busi 305 should be taken as soon as possible after Busi 105 and Econ 200.

Busi 307 should be taken after Busi 105 and Econ 200 (3rd, 4th, or 5th semester).

Busi 306 is normally taken at the end of the junior year (6th or 7th semester).

The Intermediate Economics requirement (either Econ 300 or Econ 301) should be taken in the 5th, 6th or 7th semester. Both courses and calculus are recommended for students considering an MBA or graduate school.

Electives (courses in Acct, Busi and Econ at the 300 or 400 level) may be taken in the 5th thru the 8th semester. Some electives require Busi 305, 306 or 307 as pre-requisites.

Internships for credit are normally taken between the junior and senior year. The purpose of the internship for credit is to apply the fundamental knowledge studied in business 305 and 307.

The capstone course Busi 405 or Busi 406 or Busi 409 should be taken in the 7th or 8th semester. The four “core courses” at the 300 level (Econ 300/301, Busi 305, Busi 306 and Busi 307) are required as prerequisites for the capstone course.
