

International Business

Courses are listed in the earliest semester in which it is recommended that they be taken. In most cases, the courses may be taken in a later semester without serious consequence. See the notes below for recommendations related to individual courses. The following courses are required: Business 105, 201, 205, 218, 290, 305, 306, 307, 345, and 409, Accounting 203, Economics 200, 301 and one additional approved course.

Busi 105 should be taken in the 1st or 2nd semester. In most cases, this should be the first course in the program.

Econ 200 should be taken in the 2nd or 3rd semester.

Busi 201 should be taken in the 2nd or 3rd semester.

Busi 205 should be taken in the 3rd or 4th semester. It should be taken immediately after Business 201.

Acct 203 is normally taken in the sophomore year (4th or 5th semester).

Business 218 should be taken during the sophomore year (3rd or 4th or 5th semester).

Busi 305 should be taken as soon as possible after Busi 105 and Econ 200 (3rd or 4th semester).

Busi 307 should be taken after Busi 105 and Econ 200 (4th or 5th semester).

Busi 306 is normally taken at the end of the junior year (6th or 7th semester).

Busi 345 should be taken in the 5th semester.

Econ 371 Econometrics is recommended but not required for the major.

The Macroeconomics Requirement (Econ 301) should be taken in the junior year.

The capstone course Busi 409 should be taken in the senior year. The core courses at the 300 level (Econ 301, Busi 305, 306 307 and 345) are required as prerequisites for the capstone course.

International Business majors must either study off campus or participate in a travel course (Business 290).

International Business majors are required to take one additional from this group: Hist 130, Econ 351, PolS 266, 270, or 397

Foreign Language beyond the 102 level is recommended.
