Americans with Disabilities

Act celebrated twenty-seven years of service for individuals with disabilities this past August. Guest Speaker Susan Sacco came to MC in August and discussed what the ADA law means to her, and how it has benefitted her.

Kam Williams, Director of Student Disability Services and Academic Support Programs, presented at AHEAD's National conference and also served as a Moderator there. Her presentation was on the effects of assistive technologies for students with disabilities. This marked the 40th year of the AHEAD organization. Kam will be presenting again at the AHEAD Director/Management Institute Training,

February 1-3, 2018, in New Orleans, Louisiana.
